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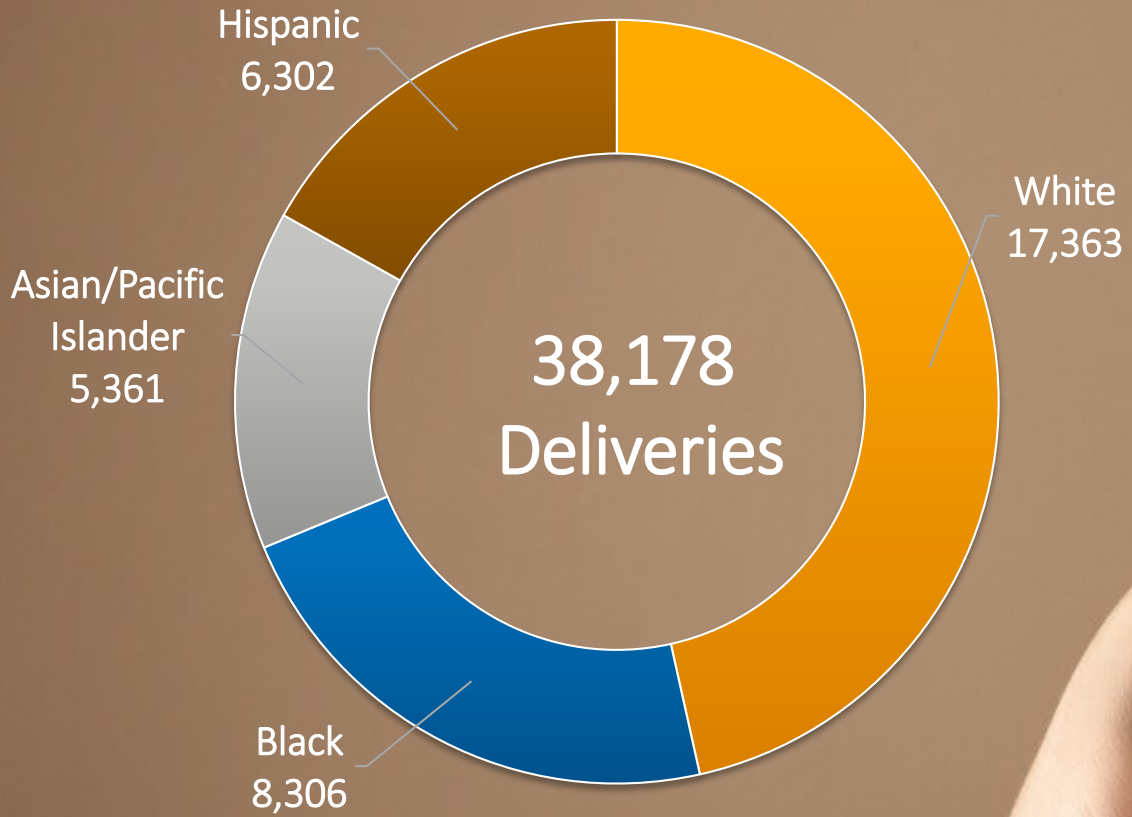

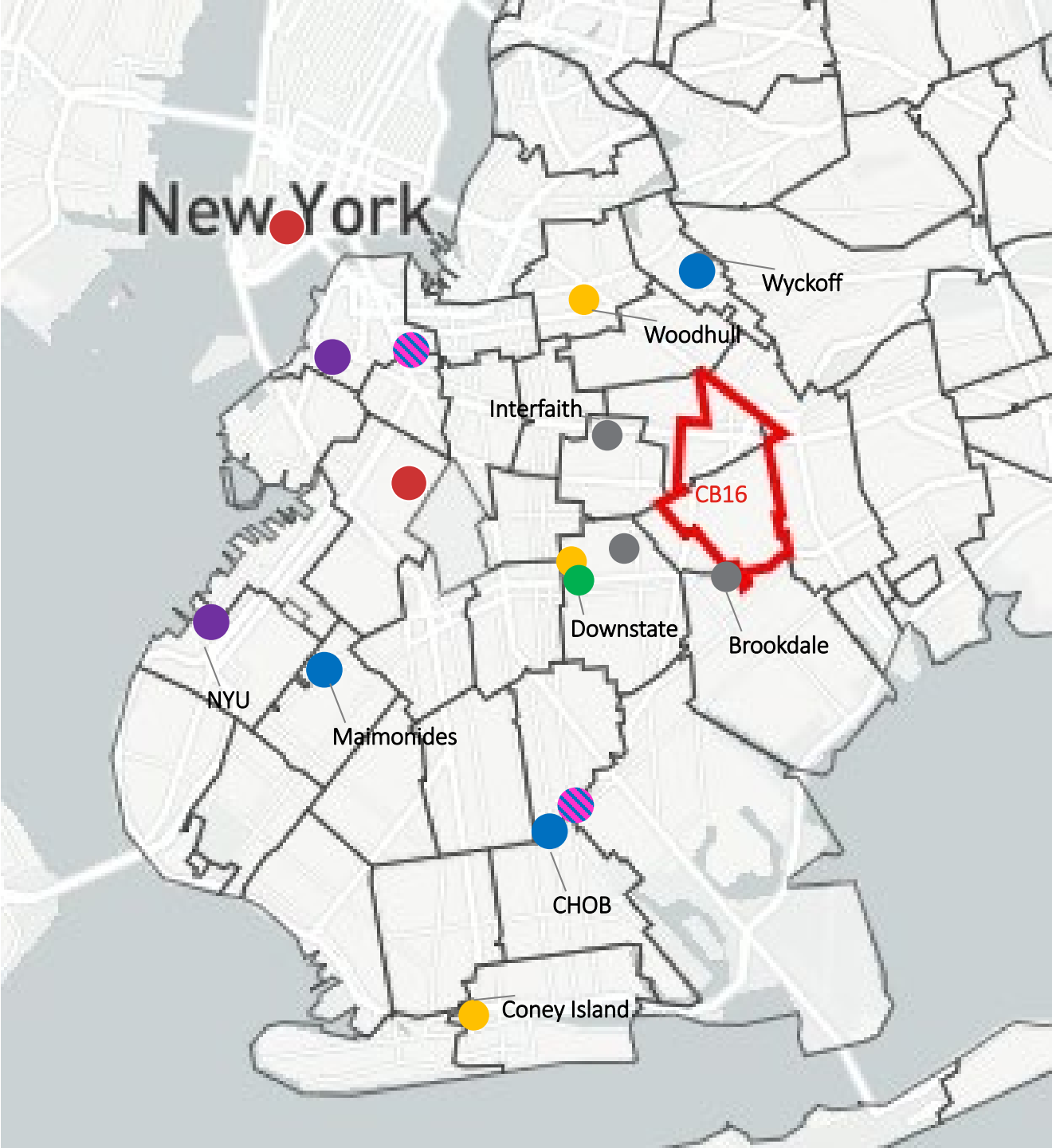


Births per year (3 yr avg) Kings County



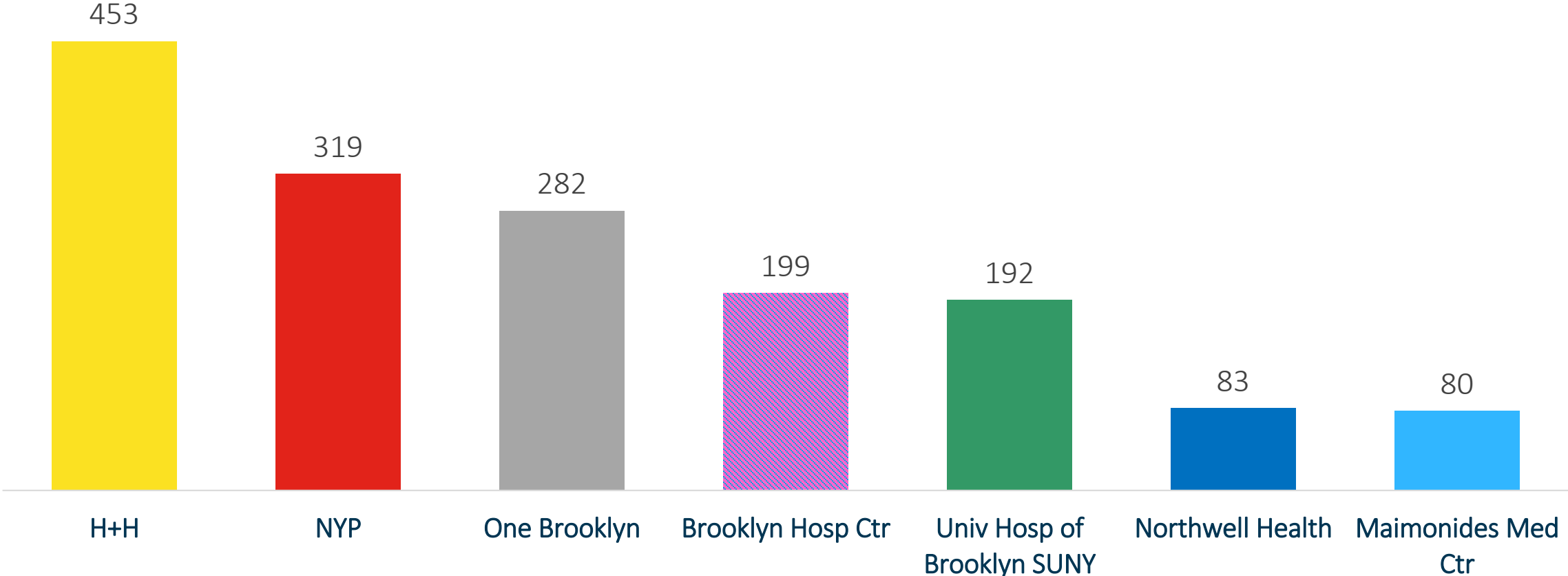

Overall star rating



The overall star rating is based on how well a hospital performs across different areas of quality, such as treating heart attacks and pneumonia, readmission rates, and safety of care.

Mortality	7 of 7 measures reported within the group
Safety of Care	8 of 8 measures reported with the group
Readmission	11 of 11 measures reported with the group
Patient Experience	8 of 8 measures reported with the group
Timely and Effective Care	12 of 14 measures reported with the group

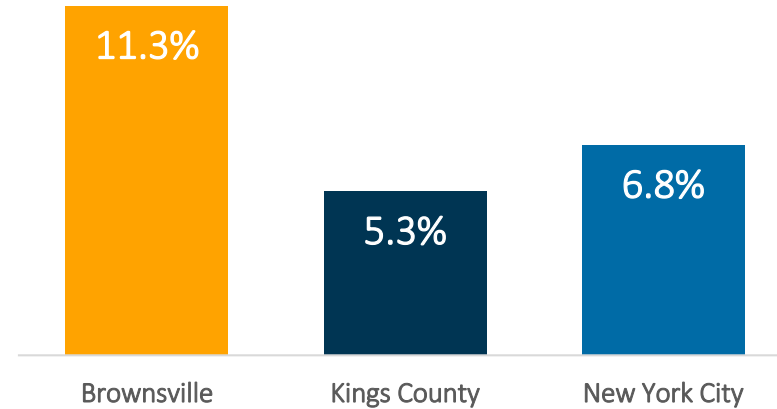

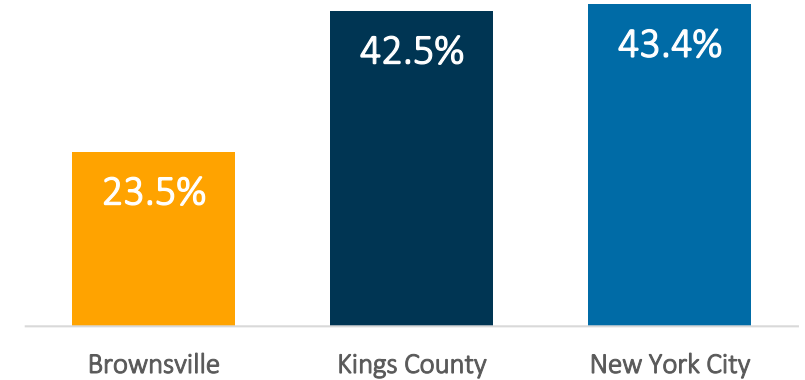
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Geographic Variation in Maternal and Infant Outcomes

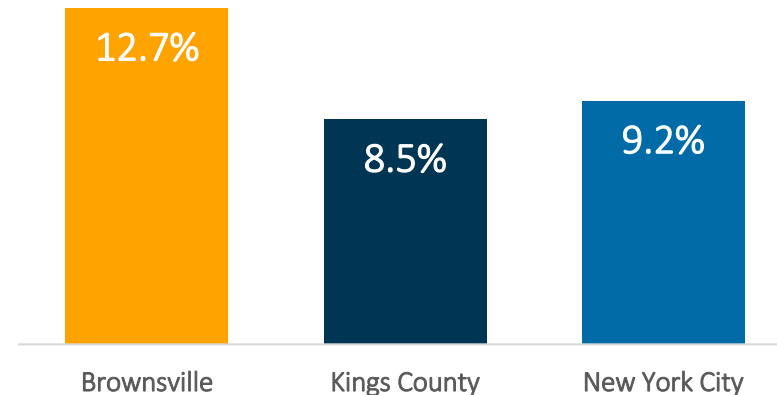

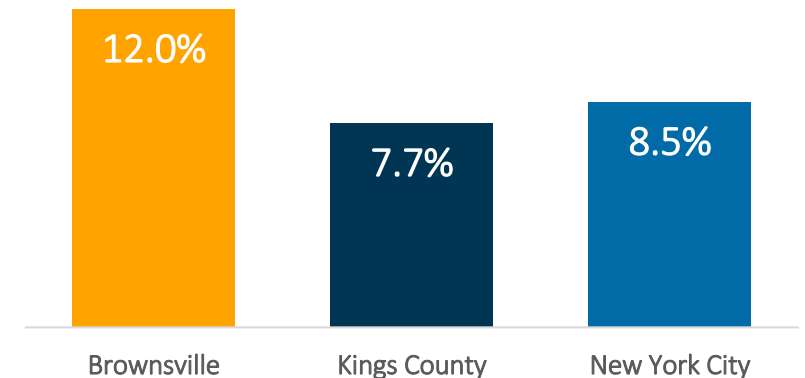

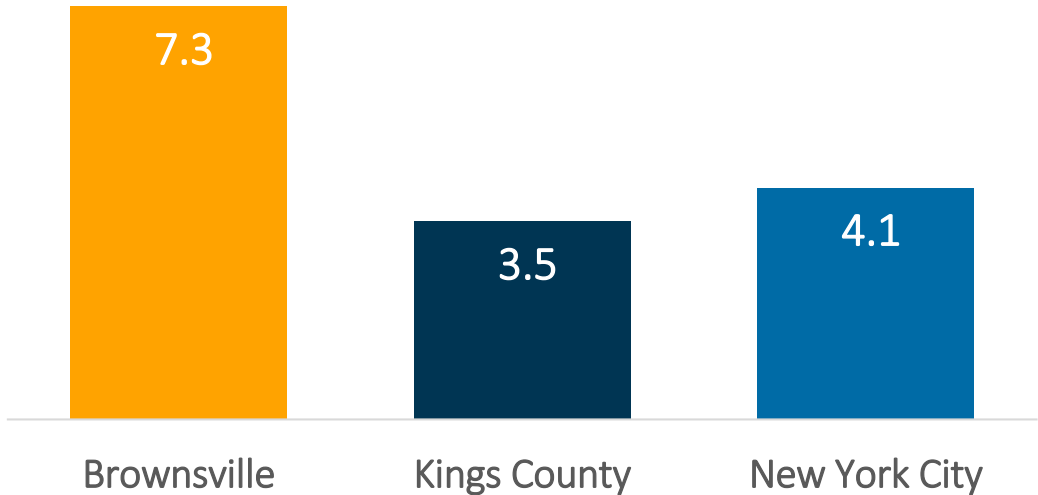
Low Birthweight Babies



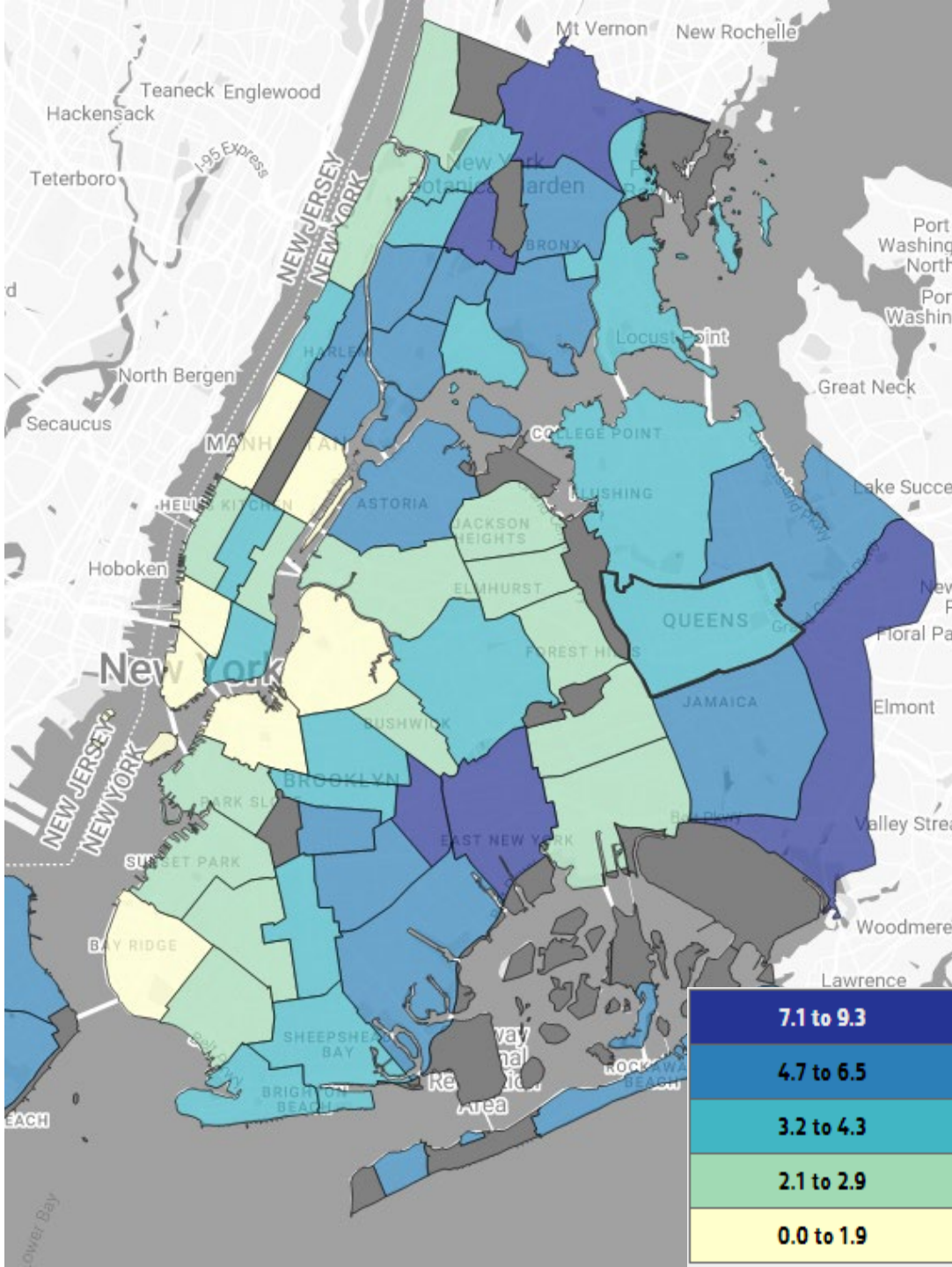
Brownsville has the 2nd highest percentage of low birthweight babies and preterm births out of the 59 neighborhoods in NYC

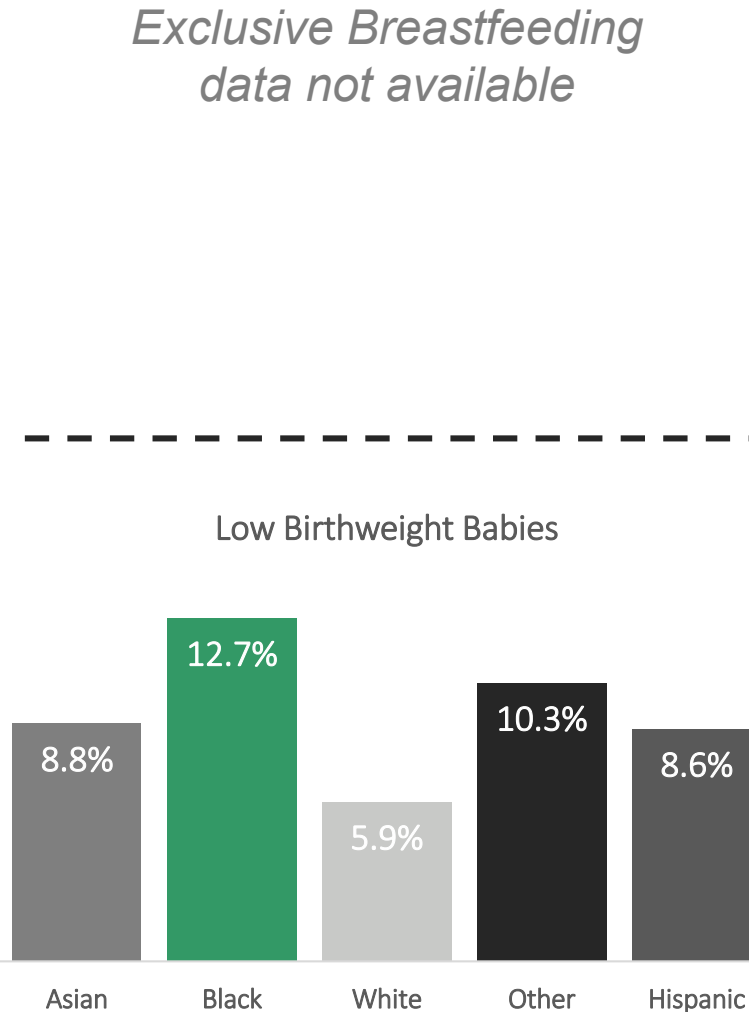
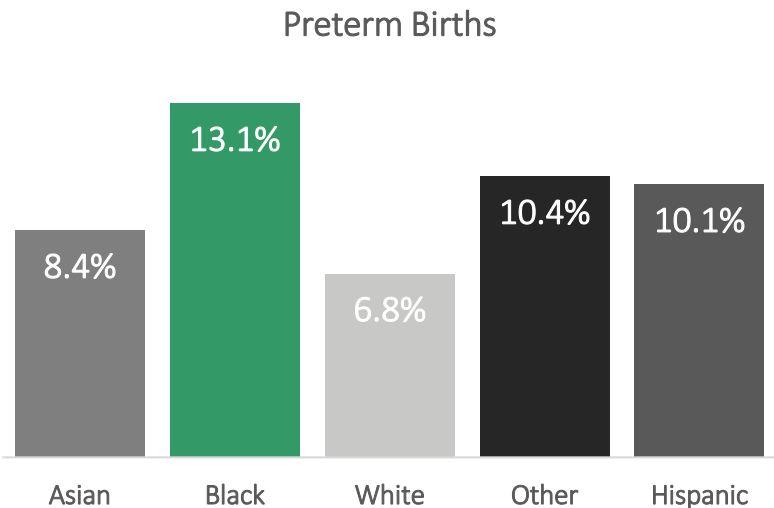
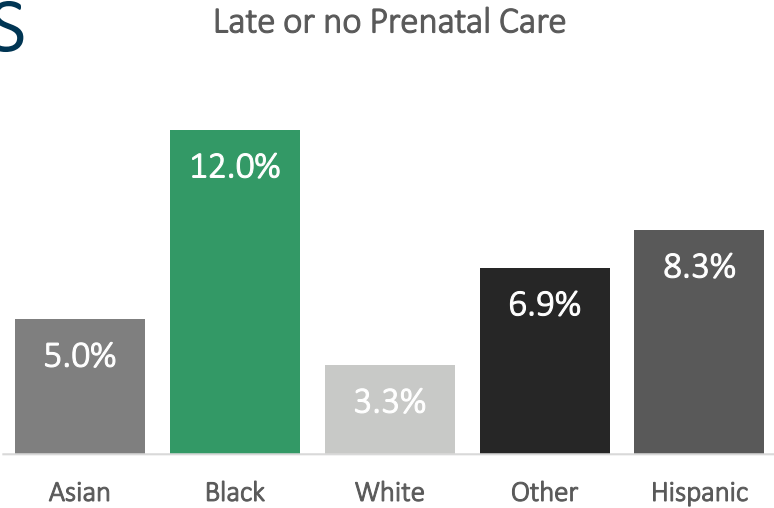

Brownsville has the 4th highest infant mortality rate among the 59 neighborhoods in NYC



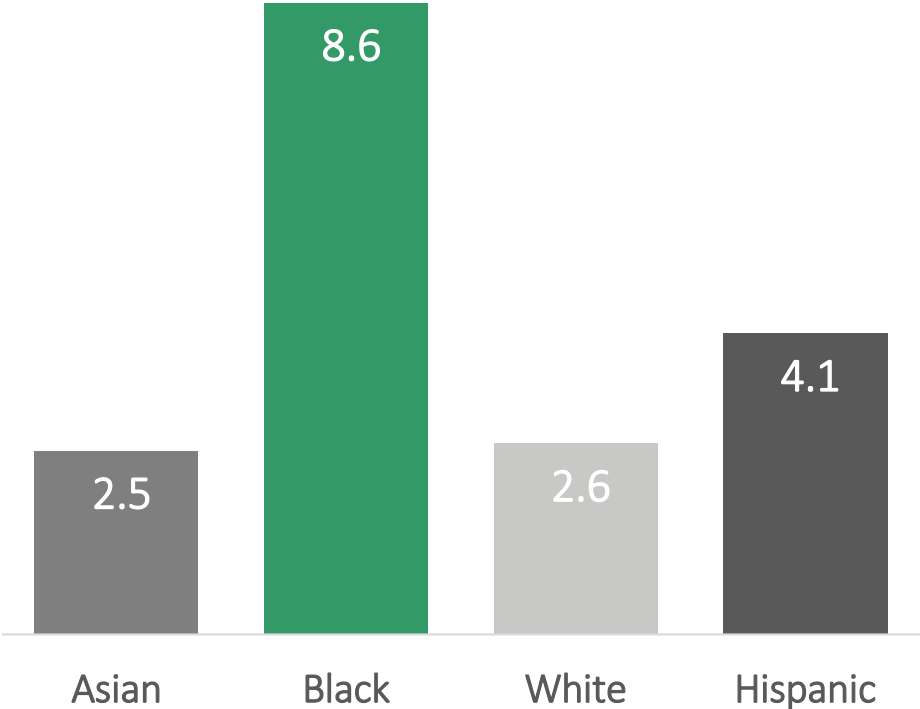
Racial/Ethnic Variation in Maternal and Infant Outcomes

Infant Mortality

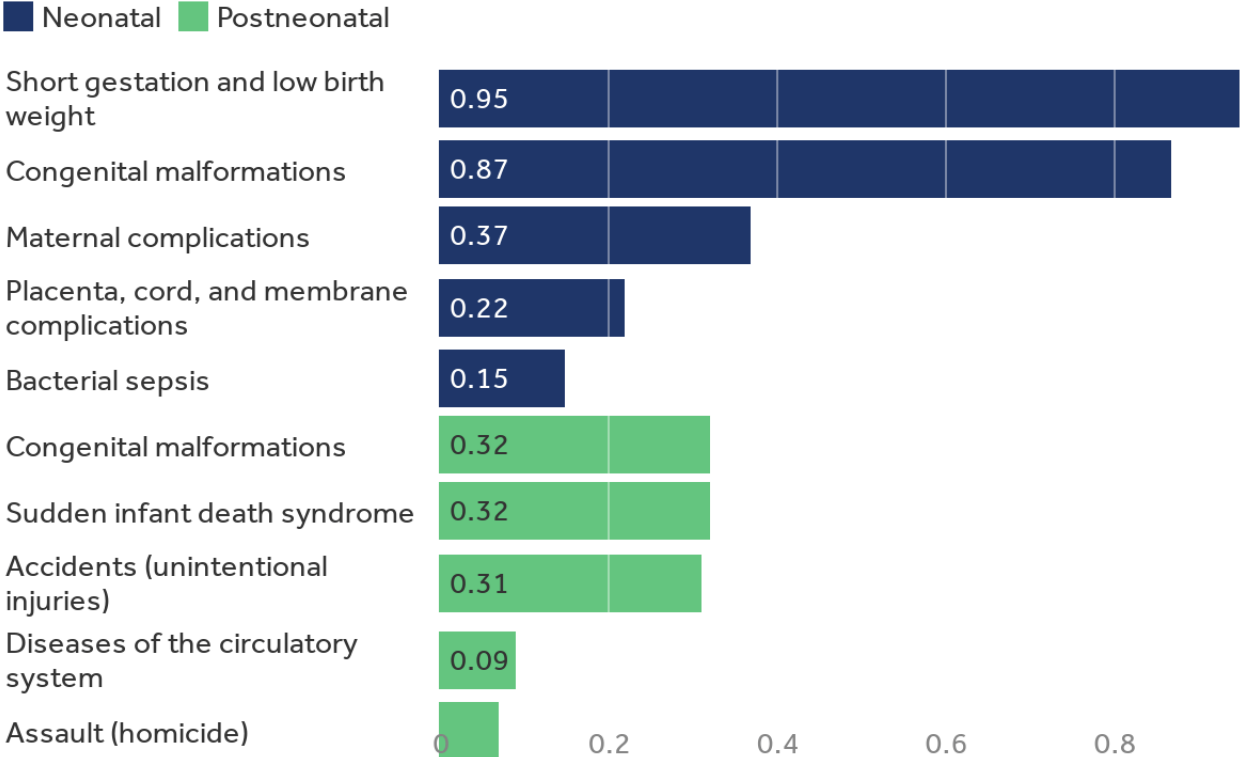

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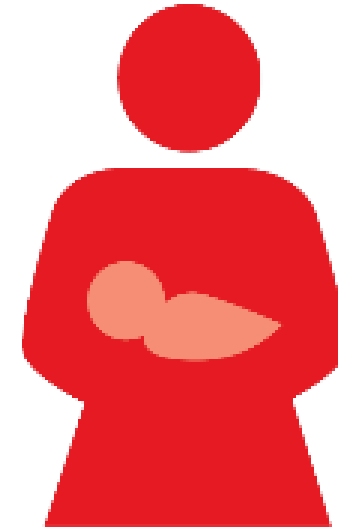

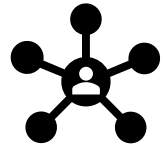

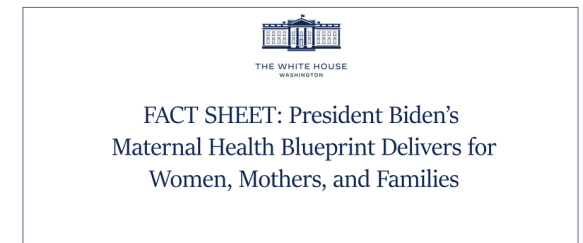
